

HOME LEARNING POLICY

RATIONALE

Effective home learning programs reflect the understanding that children learn *everywhere and at any time*. This policy reflects the Mercy values of Justice, Respect and Compassion

DEFINITIONS

Home learning includes:

- reinforcement and extension of what is done in class
- preparation for future learning
- making connections with others for collaborative learning and for acquiring resources
- · rehearsal of skills and habits
- acquiring and developing new knowledge and skills
- asynchronous learning that which does not occur in the same place at the same time, with the support of digital technologies

POLICY STATEMENT

Home learning should be engaging and purposeful. It should be:

- personalised, allowing students to pursue their natural inquisitiveness
- based on reasonable expectations
- supportive of a balanced academic, sporting and social life

The purpose of home learning is to establish and improve self-management skills and to encourage students to become self-directed learners. Home learning should foster a link between the home and learning at school.

FAMILIES AND HOME LEARNING

Educating children is best achieved by families and teachers in partnership as educators of the student. Home learning can be supported by:

- providing encouragement and support
- providing an area and environment conducive to completion of home-learning tasks
- communicating regularly with subject teachers, particularly if home-learning demands are causing a problem
- assisting in planning a home-study timetable
- accessing the CANVAS calendar to see when work is due

The College's Learning Management System, CANVAS, allows families to observe the work set, the standard of the work students submit and the feedback they receive.

HOME LEARNING EXPECTATIONS (STUDENT, STAFF AND FAMILIES)

The College expects:

- tasks set for home learning will fall within the definitions/purposes stated above
- home learning to be used to complete unfinished class tasks
- home learning not to cause undue distress
- that home learning may include completion of assessment tasks

- clear directions will be given for home learning tasks
- that work missed due to absence may be made accessible via CANVAS
- the work will be monitored by families and teachers in partnership as educators of the student
- that home learning will be completed to a satisfactory level
- communication from home to accompany incomplete home learning, where genuine circumstances exist
